

The Ministry of the Word

The First Reading

A Reading from the Book of Malachi.

¹ See, I am sending my messenger to prepare the way before me, and the Lord whom you seek will suddenly come to his temple. The messenger of the covenant in whom you delight—indeed, he is coming, says the Lord of hosts. ² But who can endure the day of his coming, and who can stand when he appears? For he is like a refiner's fire and like fullers'

soap; ³ he will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver, and he will purify the descendants of Levi and refine them like gold and silver, until they present offerings to the Lord in righteousness. ⁴ Then the offering of Judah and Jerusalem will be pleasing to the Lord as in the days of old and as in former years. ⁵ Then I will draw near to you for judgement; I will be swift to bear witness against the sorcerers, against the adulterers, against those who swear falsely, against those who oppress the hired workers in their wages, the widow, and the orphan, against those who thrust aside the alien, and do not fear me, says the Lord of hosts. ⁶ For I the Lord do not change; therefore you, O children of Jacob, have not perished. ⁷ Ever since the days of your ancestors you have turned aside from my statutes and have not kept them. Return to me, and I will return to you, says the Lord of hosts. But you say, ‘How shall we return?’ ⁸ Will anyone rob God? Yet you are robbing me! But you say, ‘How are we robbing you?’ In your tithes and offerings! ⁹ You are cursed with a curse, for you are robbing me—the whole nation of you! ¹⁰ Bring the full tithe into the storehouse, so that there may be food in my house, and thus put me to the test, says the Lord of hosts; see if I will not open the windows of heaven for you and pour down for you an overflowing blessing. ¹¹ I will rebuke the locust for you, so that it will not destroy the produce of your soil; and your vine in the field shall not be barren, says the Lord of hosts. ¹² Then all nations will count you happy, for you will be a land of delight, says the Lord of hosts. ¹³ You have spoken harsh words against me, says the Lord. Yet you say, ‘How have we spoken against you?’ ¹⁴ You have said, ‘It is vain to serve God. What do we profit by keeping his command or by going about as mourners before the Lord of hosts?’

The Second Reading

A Reading from Paul’s Letter to the Philippians

¹ Paul and Timothy, servants of Christ Jesus, To all the saints in Christ Jesus who are in Philippi, with the bishops and deacons: ² Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. ³ I thank my God every time I remember you, ⁴ constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you, ⁵ because of your sharing in the gospel from the first day until now. ⁶ I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work among you will bring it to completion by the day of Jesus Christ. ⁷ It is right for me,

to think this way about all of you, because you hold me in your heart, for all of you share in God's grace with me, both in my imprisonment and in the defence and confirmation of the gospel. ⁸ For God is my witness, how I long for all of you with the compassion of Christ Jesus. ⁹ And this is my prayer, that your love may overflow more and more with knowledge and full insight ¹⁰ to help you to determine what is best, so that on the day of Christ you may be pure and blameless, ¹¹ having produced the harvest of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ for the glory and praise of God.

¹ In the fifteenth year of the reign of Emperor Tiberius, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, and Herod was ruler of Galilee, and his brother Philip ruler of the region of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias ruler of Abilene,

² during the high-priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah in the wilderness.

³ He went into all the region around the Jordan, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins,

⁴ as it is written in the book of the words of the prophet Isaiah,

'The voice of one crying out in the wilderness:

Sermon

The Presentation

The Bishop invites all candidates and their sponsors to stand in view of the congregation and invites the sponsors of baptismal candidates to present the candidates

Bishop: We welcome Luciana who comes to be baptised. I invite her sponsors to present her now.

The sponsors answer

We present Luciana to be baptised.

Bishop: We welcome Lance who comes to be confirmed. I invite his sponsors to present him now.

The sponsors answer

We present Lance to be confirmed.

The Decision

The Bishop says to the candidates and sponsors

Before God and this congregation, you must affirm that you turn to Christ and reject all that is evil:

Do you turn to Christ?

I turn to Christ.

Do you repent of your sins?

I repent of my sins.

Do you reject selfish living, and all that is false and unjust?

I reject them all.

Do you renounce Satan and all evil?

I renounce all that is evil.

Almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness and lead you in the light of Christ to his everlasting kingdom. **Amen.**

The Bishop says to the candidates and sponsors

Will you each, by God's grace, strive to live as a disciple of Christ, loving God with your whole heart, and your neighbour as yourself, until your life's end?

We will, with God's help.

The Bishop says to the congregation

You have heard these our brothers and sisters respond to Christ. Will you support them in this calling?

The congregation answers

We will.

The Liturgical Assistant says

Let us pray.

Grant, merciful God that Luciana may be so buried with Christ in baptism that the new nature may be raised up in her. May the fruit of your Spirit grow and flourish in her. **Amen.**

Give to Luciana's sponsors and their families the desire to share with her what you have revealed in your holy gospel. **Amen.**

May Luciana know Christ's forgiving love and continue in the fellowship and service of his Church. May she proclaim, by word and example, the good news of God in Christ. **Amen.**

We thank you for the ministry we have in your world and to each other in the household of faith. Hasten that day when the whole creation shall be made perfect in Christ. **Amen.**

The Baptism

The Bishop pours water into the font and blesses it using the following prayer

We praise you, loving Father,
for the gift of your Son Jesus.
He was baptised in the River Jordan,
where your Spirit came upon him
and revealed him as the beloved.
He sent his followers
to baptise all who turn to him.
Now, Father, we ask you to bless this water,
that those who are baptised in it
may be cleansed in the water of life,
made one with Christ in his death and resurrection,
and, filled with your Spirit,
may know that they are loved as your children,
safe in Christ for ever.

The Bishop says to the sponsors and congregation

Let us affirm,
together with these who are being baptised and confirmed,
our common faith in Jesus Christ.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father,
source of all being and life,
the one for whom we exist?

I believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in God the Son,
who took our human nature,
died for us and rose again?

I believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in God the Holy Spirit,
who gives life to the people of God
and makes Christ known in the world?

I believe and trust in him.

This is the faith of the Church.
This is our faith.
We believe and trust in one God.
Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

The Bishop baptises Luciana saying

Luciana Mary Perryman, I baptise you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

The sponsors and the congregation answer

Amen.

After Baptism

The Bishop marks a cross on Luciana's forehead saying

Luciana, I sign you with the sign of the cross to show that you are marked as Christ's own forever.

The Bishop addresses Luciana

Live as a disciple of Christ:
fight the good fight,
finish the race,
keep the faith.

The congregation responds, saying

**Confess Christ crucified,
proclaim his resurrection,
look for his coming in glory.**

The Bishop addresses Luciana

Luciana, God has brought you out of darkness, into his marvellous light.

The congregation joins the Bishop saying

Shine as a light in the world to the glory of God the Father.

The Bishop continues

God has called you into his Church.

The congregation joins the Bishop saying

**We therefore receive and welcome you
as a member with us of the body of Christ,
as a child of the one heavenly Father,
and as an inheritor of the kingdom of God.**

The Confirmation

The Bishop says

Our help is in the name of the Lord
who made heaven and earth.
Blessed be the name of the Lord
now, and for ever. Amen.

The Bishop continues

Almighty and everliving God,
you have given your servant
new birth by water and the Spirit,
and have forgiven him his sins.
Strengthen him, we pray, with the Holy Spirit
that he may grow in grace.
Increase in him the spirit of wisdom
and understanding,
the spirit of discernment and inner strength,
the spirit of knowledge and true godliness,
and fill him with wonder and awe at your presence,
through Jesus Christ our Lord.
Amen.

*Lance kneels before the Bishop, who lays a hand upon
him saying*

Strengthen, Lord, your servant, Lance with your Holy Spirit.
Empower and sustain him for your service.

Lance answers with the congregation

Amen.

The congregation joins with the Bishop in saying this prayer after Lance has received the laying on of hands

**Defend, O Lord, this your servant
with your heavenly grace,
that he may continue yours for ever,
and daily increase in your Holy Spirit more and more
until he comes to your everlasting kingdom. Amen.**

After the Laying of Hands

The Bishop says

Almighty and everliving God,
watch over this your servant Lance
upon whom we have now laid our hands.
Let your Holy Spirit always be with him
and lead him to know and obey your word,
that he may serve you in this life,
and dwell with you in the life to come:
through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Let nothing ever separate me from your love, for you live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.
